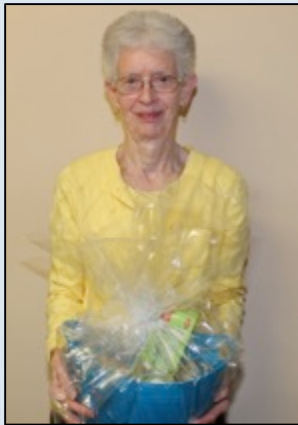

We wish you well in your new ventures and hope that you will continue to share your skills and expertise.

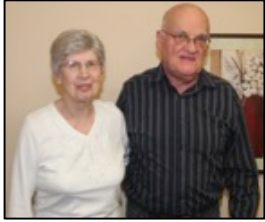


### **Martha Elliott**

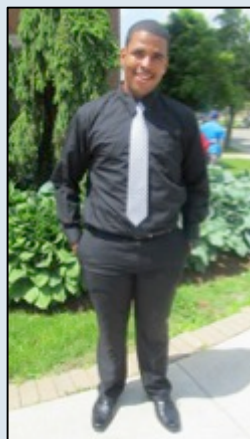
### Al and Vera Cross

## Heartfelt Thank You for a very Merry Christmas!

It seems strange typing about Christmas on a lovely spring day but we wanted to share once again our appreciation. When I run into folks in the community, they are still saying thank you for all the joy we brought to Christmas.

We are so lucky to have so many generous supporters of our ELUCO families in our midst. Richards Memorial provided gifts for 30 children on their angel tree. Metropolitan provided Christmas food hampers for 17 families. Siloam donated 5 turkeys, 5 hams and 2 turkey breasts. First-St. Andrews donated \$3000 in grocery and gift cards. Each classroom at Stoneybrook Public School sponsored a child totaling 20 children. Thorndale UCW, Rose Birrell and several families each sponsored a family with gifts and food. ELUCO sponsored 50 families this year. Many volunteers including some of the families receiving assistance come together for gift wrapping and deliveries. Indeed, there are angels among us.
