



Who we are...

East London United Church Outreach (ELUCO) is a United Church ministry founded in 1984 that advocates for and supports people to build community in the midst of challenging circumstances. ELUCO's annual budget is approximately \$100,000. ELUCO needs your support with our fundraising efforts to help meet our needs. Funds generated from the Walk and Roll for Families on September 30, 2018 go directly to the work of our community worker, Nancy Howard, and Wednesday hospitality lunch program.

Our one paid full-time Community Outreach Worker develops programs to assist those in need to become more self-reliant.

This ministry primarily serves the Marconi community of south-east London, but also includes the ELUCO Food Cupboard at Gethsemane Gardens and the Welcome Wednesday Hospitality Lunch program in the Huron East corridor of north-east London.

- Opportunities to discuss relevant issues of concern and brainstorm solutions to effect change
- Collective Kitchen providing social time, team work in meal planning and preparation, and an opportunity to learn about other cultures
- Moms and Tots facilitates short term themed programs to learn and grow
- Sponsored day trips and camp registration to give families the opportunities they would not otherwise experience
- Ready for School to help ease children beginning Jr. Kindergarten into school activities
- Provide backpacks, school supplies and snacks for back-to-school
- Post-secondary education scholarship fund to assist students in their first year with books and tuition
- Love and hope to families through hampers of food and gifts at Christmas as well as a lunch and party for families and other activities during March Break and holidays.

Nancy is also available for counselling and support for individuals and families. She is an advocate at schools, court, Children's Aid Society, Ontario Works, Ontario Disability Support Program, London Middlesex Housing Corporation, Housing Access Centre, Housing Stability Bank, Union Gas and London Hydro. She works with colleagues in the Advocates Group to lobby for social justice for low-income families and is able to make referrals to various agencies to support families.

My goodness the summer just flew by! Packed with outdoor fun, it is one of my favourite times of the year. Without a doubt summer camps are the highlight for our Marconi community.

Through the generosity of our sponsors we were able to send 18 children to Camp Kee-Mo-Kee and 25 children to Stevenson Children's Camp. One of our youth participated in the Counsellor in Training program, and we had two Counsellors from our ELUCO families at Camp Kee-Mo-Kee. As well, the Program Director grew up with us! It brings great joy to watch these children grow and develop the skills that lead to successful futures. Children love attending our month-long Social Skills Camp where they work hard learning ten skills necessary for success in society. Three Staff and a Jr. Leader provided lots of opportunities to practice these skills in fun group activities. The children's faces beam with pride at the Graduation Ceremony when the staff present them with a photo plaque and share their story of successful learning. An important aspect of this camp is building relationships, so there are tears shed with goodbyes at the end of the month. Parents and teachers both reported noticing a difference in these children. The success of the Social Skills Camp program is over 25 years running.

We sponsored 3 children to attend the Go Project at First-St. Andrew's United Church. This program allows children/youth to really explore their faith and to participate in Mission and Service. Visits to several local organizations provided this team with a better understanding of the needs in our own community and how we can make a difference.

I am truly blessed to have a job where I can share the lives and support of so many amazing people. With love in my heart, thank you all.




Savannah Shines!
